

Who is Jesus?, Pt. 4: The Great Divide

People generally have a positive view of Jesus. But engage someone in a conversation about Jesus, and tensions may rise a bit. Why is that? He was a teacher whose primary ethic was love and service, so why would people become uneasy with a conversation about Jesus? Maybe it is because Jesus made some pretty stark claims about himself; claims that cause people to make a choice one way or the other.

Bottom Line: Jesus is the bridge to God.

Discussion Questions

- 1. In today's culture, what qualities about Jesus are most admired even by people who don't believe he was anything more than a religious, moral teacher? What qualities about Jesus do you admire most?
- 2. **Read Leviticus 19:18 and John 13:34-35.** In what way was Jesus' command new? What was different about it? What is difficult about following this command?
- 3. **Read Luke 12:49-53**. How is Jesus' statement here different than the way people commonly perceive him? Why do you think he made this statement? What is your reaction to his statement?
- 4. **Read John 14:6**. What is your reaction to Jesus' claim? A common belief is that there are many paths or ways to God. In what ways does Jesus statement leave room for this belief? Why do people have a negative reaction to Jesus' claim? Have you ever had a conversation with a person who disagrees with Jesus' claim? Discuss.
- 5. **Read John 14:1-11.** What are the claims that Jesus makes in these verses? Are these claims unifying or divisive? Discuss.
- 6. Think about your current life. If Jesus is the way in what areas of your life do you need to follow him more closely? If Jesus is the truth in what things do you need to believe him more? If Jesus is the life how are you receiving him daily?
- 7. What has been the most helpful thought/idea from the message this week? How has that thought/idea helped you?
- 8. How can the group encourage you this week?
