6. **Read Romans 12:2.** Though this verse isn't speaking directly about finances, how is it helpful to this topic? What could you do to transform your mind when it comes to managing your finances?
7. **Read Proverbs 11:25.** Why do you think the Scriptures say so much about giving and generosity?
8. To what degree have you included God in your financial decisions and plan? Explain.
9. What has been the most helpful thought/idea from the message this week? How has that thought/idea helped you?
10. How can the group encourage you this week?
