



Pt. 2: Paul and Timothy

The apostle Paul spent a better part of his life committed to the discipleship of Timothy. To this day, God has never stopped calling his followers to lead others to him. All Christians have been called to make disciples who make disciples. God wants to use you in the lives of other people. Will you let him?

Bottom Line: God has called us to a life of discipleship.

Discussion Questions:

1. Have you ever started a job that you weren't really ready for? Share details about your experience.
2. **Read Philippians 2:19-22.** Name a person who is strong in their faith that you would recommend a new believer or someone seeking faith talk to? What about them makes you recommend them?
3. **1 Timothy 4:12-16.** When you were younger, what advice were you given that has stuck with you today? What would you tell a young person today?
4. What gift has God given you that should be shared with the younger generation in your church?
5. **Read 2 Timothy 4:1-7.** Towards the end of his life, the apostle Paul knows that he has to pass the torch. He comes alongside Timothy and teaches him what he'll need to know in order to carry forward the Great Commission. In this passage, what did Paul want Timothy to be prepared for? How have you prepared yourself to speak to others about your faith?
6. In what ways are you a reliable servant of God? What can you do this week toward discharging all your duties as a Christian?
7. What has been the most helpful thought/idea from the message this week? How has that thought/idea helped you?
8. How can the group pray for or encourage you this week?

*If time doesn't allow for you to discuss all of these questions, use only the ones you feel would be most helpful for your group.
