

Prayer & Fasting: Pt. 2; Praying With Urgency & Faith

Too often, prayer is not our first option when we are faced with a difficult situation. We try first to fix things ourselves, without getting God involved, without praying. What we should realize, is that we need to turn to God as a first resort - with faith that he can help us. He wants us to come to him with immediate, bold, and specific prayers.

Bottom Line: God delights in our urgent prayers of faith.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you were persistence in a situation? What was the outcome?
- 2. What is your first response when you are faced with a difficult situation?
- 3. Do you find it difficult to pray? Why do you think people struggle with prayer?
- 4. Describe a time when you persistently prayed for something. What was the result? How did that impact your faith?
- 5. What connection is there between a person's faith and answered prayers?
- 6. **Read Mark 10:46-52.** What do the blind man's (Bartimaeus) actions tell you about his attitude toward Jesus? How did the blind man's actions reveal to Jesus that he had bold faith?
- 7. In verse 52, Jesus said that Bartimaeus' <u>faith</u> had saved him. What do you think Jesus meant by that?
- 8. What situation do you need to bring to God in bold, specific, & persistent prayer?
- 9. What has been the most helpful thought/idea from the message this week? How has that thought/idea helped you?
- 10. How can the group encourage you this week?
