



On A Mission: Pt. 5; Invest In A Few

Jesus spent the majority of his ministry spending time with and investing in 12 men who would later go out into the world and spread the Gospel. As a church, we want to do for others what Jesus did for us. We must be an active participant in the mission of the church by intentionally investing in others so that we create disciples who then go out and make more disciples.

Bottom Line: A disciple is the result of someone who has moved from being the recipient of the church's mission to being responsible for the church's mission.

Discussion Questions:

1. How do you encourage a friend who is down and feeling hopeless?
2. How can investing your life in someone pay eternal dividends?
3. What practical things can we do to strengthen and encourage others in their faith?
4. How can you help a young believer whose faith is just beginning, or has been damaged, find or strengthen their relationship in Jesus?
5. **Read 2 Timothy 2:2.** When you read this passage, do you feel encouraged or challenged? Why? What can you do to live this passage out in your own life?
6. How can we take what we learn and experience on Sunday into our daily lives Monday through Saturday? What do you think the result would be in our communities if we did that?
7. What has been the most helpful thought/idea from the message this week? How has that thought/idea helped you?
8. How can the group encourage you this week?

*If time doesn't allow for you to discuss all of these questions, use only the ones you feel would be most helpful for your group.
